

ANSWERS TO VENDOR QUESTIONS FOR BURKE RFP #103 PHSL (3/24/25)

1. Implementing an onsite pharmacy is a business operation review and in order to assess volume, drug mix, and estimated cost and value of onsite pharmacy, we are requesting a full review of your utilization that was prescribed to your population in the past 12 months to clearly assess the opportunity.

To clearly understand the expected outcome of the RFP request:

Is your RFP for onsite pharmacy request for **all claims**, to include, general revenue, third party payors, and PAP medication management for fully integrated system?

As stated in the RFP, this contract will be for those individuals at Burke who choose to access the onsite retail pharmacy. This could mean Burke pay, third party payers, or self-pay. RFP does not encompass PAP medication program at Burke.

2. Will general revenue funded prescriptions be filled by onsite pharmacy? In reference to 1.c, states "Provision of pharmaceutical services for Burke paid prescriptions as determined by Burke" so, would like to confirm that general revenue claims and other third-party payors would be processed at onsite pharmacy?

General revenue, or "Burke Pay" prescriptions will be requested on an as needed basis and approved only by a facility Service Director prior to fill for payment billing processing.

*Location Code – This is important to assess "pharmacy sites"; if you have additional rural distribution locations, we will do a full assessment as a whole, then break it out to the locations to assess utilization from each site. If unable to provide this field, we would assess it as 1 location volume. i.e. Lufkin, Waxahachie, SUD, etc.

The Center attempts to verify insurance at each client visit. Burke pay approval and invoicing requests for medications are carefully scrutinized to prevent any unnecessary payments to pharmacy by Burke. The Center appreciates any efforts to return payment to the Center in this event.

19. RE: Q 1.t; how many shipping locations would be receiving mail prescriptions? Do these locations currently receive prescriptions by mail from onsite pharmacy provider?

No, Burke does not receive mail ordered medication prescriptions at our outlying locations directly from retail pharmacy. Mail outs are sent directly to the client's home via Fed Ex. There may be occasions when pharmacy may provide their own courier /medications between their 2 retail pharmacies to accommodate a specific pharmacy and client need. This is a pharmacy decision and Burke does not oversee that process.

20. For PAP medications, our onsite pharmacy provider services has an integrated system to include PAP inventory and management, will PAP medications be stored/dispensed at the onsite pharmacy?

Answer: To clarify: Burke is the name of our regional mental health center encompassing an 11-county area. We currently utilize the retail pharmacy for ordering Long-Acting Antipsychotic Injections for those persons with a payor source/ insured individual. Individuals who require PAP and are uninsured are served under a different pharmacy.
